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A Cultural Seminar at Darb Al-Saai Discusses the Challenges and Achievements of the Qatari Theater

Theater Affairs Center organized a seminar on the main stage at Darb Al-Saai, in which theatre critic Dr. Hassan Rashid, artist and poet Ali Mirza and artist Faleh Fayez participated in that seminar, and it was moderated by Ahmed Al-Saadi.

Participants praised the cultural role played by the National Day Celebrations Committee in Darb Al-Saai on the occasion of the National Day, stressing that the cultural and theatrical events in particular enhance the presence of the Qatari theatre in the public, praising all the heritage and artistic activities presented at Darb Al-Saai, which has become one of the most important cultural landmarks and destinations in Qatar today, in conjunction with the hosting of the FIFA World Cup Qatar 2022.

Dr. Hassan Rashid reviewed the most important stations in the history of the Qatari theatre by observing the movement of the theatre and its developments for several successive generations, and the most prominent names that contributed to the brilliance of the prosperity of the Qatari theater, such as Musa Abdulrahman, Ali Mirza, Abdulrahman Al-Mas, Abdulrahman Al-Mannai, Hamad Al-Rumaihi, Ghanim Al-Sulaiti, Muhammad Bujsum and others who contributed to developing the Qatari Theatre, referring to the importance of the theater troupe, which was established in the sixties of the last century, which had a profound effect on a theatrical renaissance.

He pointed out that there are many factors that affected the theater, not only in Qatar, but throughout the Arab world, as new media emerged that contributed to moving away from the theater, stressing that the development of local theater requires deliberate plans, presenting the basics of theatrical performance, an expanded theater festival for all, and the return of scholarships to study theatre, in addition to provide specialized artistic workshops by skilled people in various arts, stressing that Qatari artists are able to restore this brilliance with the support of the Ministry of Culture.

The artist and poet Ali Mirza dealt with aspects of the history of the Qatari theater, pointing out that the beginnings were with sports clubs, as well as the role of scout camps and secondary schools, then the establishment of the Al-Adwaa troupe that presented several improvisational plays, after that the









He said that the emergence of the Qatari theater began in the sixties of the last century, and the idea was crystallized in the Teachers' House by Professor Muhammad Abdullah Al-Ansari and a large group of artists who created a new movement, so the Qatari theater group was formed to be the nucleus of new groups such as Al-Adwaa, the Arab theater, and the popular theater. The Qatari theater shined at this time until it went out to far horizons in the Arab world.

Mirza stressed that the theatrical movement can flourish, provided that a fixed theatrical season is organized and binding by the Ministry of Culture, that the World Theater Day is seriously celebrated, and the Doha Theater Festival returns, which will create new aspects in writing, acting and directing, with the need to pay attention to school theater.

The artist Faleh Fayez talked about the emergence of the Qatari theatre and the most important troupes that contributed to its renaissance historically, as they presented three theatrical shows per day, pointing out that the decisions of merging between the troupes were not in the interest of the Qatari theatre, as the required harmony did not occur among all. Fayez said that the playwrights during this period were able to face many challenges in order to be present in the theatrical field, stressing that the playwrights have not lost their passion for the theatre, but they need a new strategy from the Ministry of Culture that restores the glow of the Qatari theatre, through a full theatrical season, and the presence of an important role for the permanent theatre committee, which It was made up of troupe leaders and a number of elements interested in theatre.



The people of Darb Al-Saai were surprised by the gathering of dozens of Brazilian fans, and they chanted the famous «Ole...Ole, Ole, Ole» song, while performing straight collective jumps that Seleção fans are accustomed to.

The fans wore the yellow shirts of the Brazilian national team, but added to them the Qatari traditional Ghutra and aghal. Brazilians who came to learn about the Qatari heritage participated

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in the various activities and events of Darb Al-Saai, such as the Qatari Arda (traditional dance show) and camel riding, as well as they were briefed on the various activities and events. Some female fans also wore the Qatari abaya and shawl.

Fernando Ponts, Brazilian fans lead, said the Darb Al-Saai is a great place and we are happy to be here. We have seen hospitality since we arrived in the festive arena, and this visit is a an opportunity to promote cultures exchange between the Qatari and Brazilian people. We have learned about the Qatar history, its people from the past, and what they used to do as professions. Camel riding and drinking Arabic coffee in traditional tents «Bait Al-Shaer» and the fact that this atmosphere is such a great experience.

As for his opinion as a fan group lead on Qatar hosting the World Cup and his experience visiting Darb Al-Saai, he said: «Before my visit to Qatar I did not expect this huge amount of welcome and hospitality as well as the great organization of everything, Qataris took care of every detail no matter how small, we really feel at home.»

He added: «I would like to express my deep admiration for the diversity present in Qatar. Qatar built the most luxurious sports stadiums and buildings and provided the best routes and means of transportation. At the same time, it did not lose sight of its past, heritage and culture. On the contrary, we see the Qatari people holding their roots and always proud.» This place that we are in today, Darb Al-Saai, is the best example of Qatar reviving its history and preserving its rich heritage while continuing to move forward and advance in all these various fields".

Paulo Machado praised Darb Al-Saai's events highlighting Qatari heritage, pointing out that he enjoyed his experience there, and described camel riding as so much fun. He added that Qatar presented a special version of the FIFA World Cup Qatar 2022, and were able to express their culture to the peoples of the world through the World Cup. He explained that he was visiting Darb Al-Saai for the first time, during which he learned about the Qatari customs and traditions in which the people of Qatar, who have gained the respect of the people of the world, cherished their identity and culture.

Olympio said that he loved Darb Al-Saai very much, especially as it is a place that represents the old Qatari heritage and Qatari culture, pointing out that the reception was great on the part of the organizers, and that he and his friends enjoyed being in the heart of the festivities. He added that for the first time he sees this atmosphere and for him it is a new, very wonderful and special experience and he will come back to Qatar with his friends. He will not forget Qatar nor such wonderful places when he returns to Brazil.

Daniela said it was her first time visiting a place like Darb Al-Saai. She said it was so much fun and she has seen a lot of wonderful things and took many photos that will remain in her memory from her trip to Qatar.

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The Children's Theatre in Darab Al-Saai held a puppetry workshop yesterday, that witnessed a large turnout of children and their parents to learn about puppet making. The workshop was presented by a group of trainers specializing in the making of puppets.

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Sama Al Dahir, a manufacturer and puppeteer at the Theatre Affairs Center in charge of the workshop, said that the workshop aims to open



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the eyes of children to ways they can be innovative by using simple materials available in each house. «Tweezers» as they are available in each house, along with other materials such as carton, which they could utilise to create animal puppets.

She pointed out that children can design puppets that look like animals in one of the stories to play with it, so that their sense of innovation grows, and at the same time open the eyes of parents to the importance of creating such environment for children.

Dahir explained that there are 11 puppet workshops that will be offered in Darb Al-Saai, where different materials will be used for each workshop, all of which are simple materials available in the houses. She said they teach children how to manufacture these puppets from scratch and make them move and make sounds.

People of Qatar and Falcons... A deeply rooted relationship from grandparents to children in Darb AlSaai

As part of the initiatives of the Ministry of Culture to preserve the heritage of the country, The National Day Organizing Committee has set up a special corner that embodies the life of "Arab Badia" in events such as Al-Aziza, which means the house of poetry, showcasing hunting equipment. Al-Maqtar is another activity that consists of a series of activities specific to the "Badia" life. The most important of these is "Al-Qanas Al-Sagheer" (young sniper) event, which aims to teach the children about handling falcons with care and how to carry them on their hands unharmed, and to train them to hunt smaller birds.



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Falcons are one of the most important elements of Qatar's heritage and in many Gulf countries, where Arabs have long nurtured them for their superior ability to fish and capture preys, which has been inherited by generations from the earliest time and preserved by the people of Qatar from older people and then transferred to younger ones and children.

In this regard, Mr. Abdelrahman Ahmed Al-Badi Al-Ma>adeed, President of the Al-Muqtar and Al-Azbah Events, said that this event was very important to showcase the land and Bedouin heritage of the people of Qatar. He added that the events offered by Al-Maqtar and Al-Azbah sought to link new generations to the lives of parents and grandparents while the new generation learns about the struggles of fathers and grandparents in order to build the present of this country without forgetting its past and inherent heritage.
